Scope: any continent on which the Jesuits engaged in educational, artistic, scientific, or religious activity, 1540s-1700.

2. Environmental studies: papers or panels concerning the role of Jesuits in shaping or changing the physical environment in which they worked; issues related to construction, agricultural practices, adaptation, use of materials not known in Europe, etc. Scope: any continent on which the Jesuits engaged in educational, artistic, scientific, or religious activity, 1540s-1700.
