

## **Ojos al Mundo: The Global Middle Ages from the Iberian Perspective**

In conjunction with the [NEH Immersive Global Middle Ages Advanced Digital Humanities Institute](#), we invite students, faculty, and independent researchers to collaboratively propose two in-person ASPHS (Association for Spanish and Portuguese Historical Studies) panels that consider medieval Spain and Portugal in broader global contexts. Panel one, composed of individual papers in progress, might focus on material, intellectual, and imaginary connections between Iberia and any other non-European region in the world or minority communities within Europe. Papers that explore new methods and processes of analysis and presentation, in particular those pertaining to the digital humanities, are highly encouraged. A second panel invites up to five persons to participate in a group panel discussion on key themes, topics, methods, and challenges that Iberian scholars encounter when working in global contexts. The second panel will be highly interactive with the audience so as to generate a robust communal debate and discussion.
